

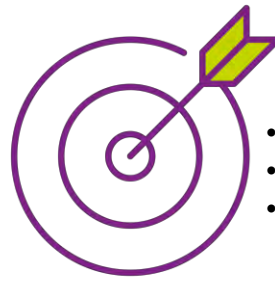

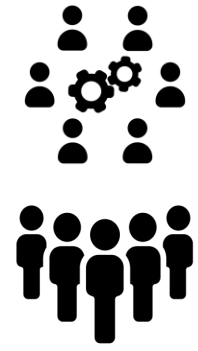

- Adults with incomplete degrees or certificates



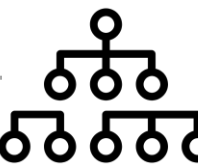

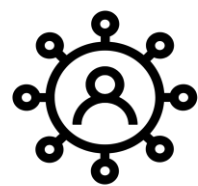

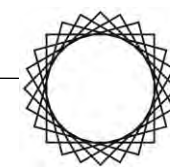

Increase in percentage of third grade students with satisfactory reading scores

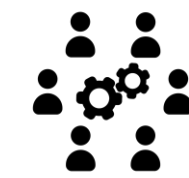

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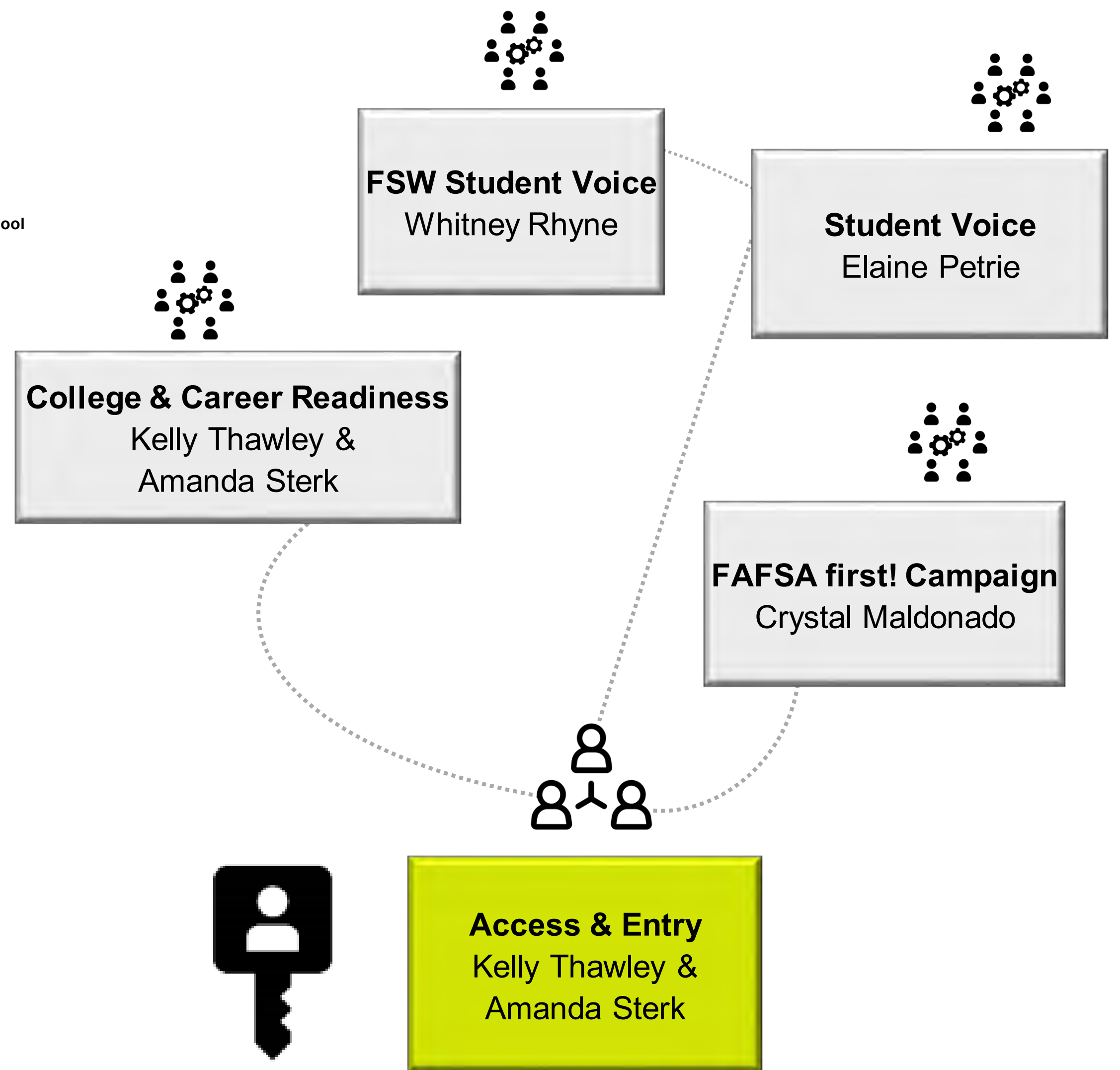
